Stream Introduction

Building a resilient environment features 26 events, focused on the role of forestry in achieving global environmental goals. Events will cover forests' and land use contribution to addressing the challenges of climate change, including progress towards REDD+ in various regions, the importance of peatland forests, advances in forest monitoring, and the prospects for new avenues of forest finance to meet these challenges. The Stream will launch with an expert discussion examining the gap between long-term aspirations and current progress towards a comprehensive role for forests in building a resilient global environment; to explore the emerging importance of forests in the era of green growth. The stream will include the launch of guidelines in agroforestry and peatland management, a series of discussions on forest invasive species, and seminars and training on interactive mapping and inventory tools.
